What is Safe at Home?

Safe at Home is an address confidentiality program to help crime victims and their families in their efforts to stay safe.

How Does Safe at Home Work?

Safe at Home provides a substitute address for survivors to use on new public records created by government agencies and the courts such as:

- Driver license or state identification cards
- Law enforcement reports
- City and county services and records
- Public school enrollment
- Social services benefits
- Voter registration
- Library cards
- Court documents

Safe at Home may be right for:

- Survivors of domestic violence, sexual assault, stalking, human trafficking, rape or other crimes.
- Victims of crime who have recently relocated or are planning to relocate because they fear future harm.
- Individuals who understand that Safe at Home is one piece of a comprehensive safety plan.
- Residents of Missouri.
