SUMMARY OF COMMENTS: No comments were received.

ORDER OF RULEMAKING

By the authority vested in the Attorney General under section 407.1101, RSMo 2000, the Attorney General adopts a rule as follows:

15 CSR 60-13.010 is adopted.

A notice of proposed rulemaking containing the text of the proposed rule was published in the *Missouri Register* on October 16, 2000 (25 MoReg 2538). Those sections with changes are reprinted here. This proposed rule becomes effective thirty days after publication in the *Code of State Regulations*.

SUMMARY OF COMMENTS: The Attorney General received fifteen comments on the proposed rule.

COMMENT: St. Louis University commented that the definition of "bona fide member" appearing in proposed rule restricts the university's ability to conduct fund raising.

RESPONSE: The Attorney General has considered this comment. The term "bona fide member" is used in section 407.1095, RSMo 2000. The definition of "bona fide member" in the proposed rule tracks the language that defines "member" in the state's general not-for-profit corporation statute, section 355.066(21), RSMo 1994. Accordingly, the Attorney General has decided to make no change to section (2), subsection (B) of the rule.

COMMENT: A litary of commenters protested the inclusion of the concept of income generating activities to define "business contact" and "current business relationship," terms whose definitions appear in section (2), subsections (C) and (D), respectively. The nature of the comments is that inclusion of those proposed definitions exceeds the legislature's intent in granting exceptions to the "no call" statute.

RESPONSE AND EXPLANATION OF CHANGE: After considering the comments, the Attorney General has decided to amend the proposed rule doing away with the concept of income generating activities to define "business contact" and "current business relationship."

COMMENT: Through internal review, the Attorney General noted that using the term "human being" in the definition of "person" that appears in section (2), subsection (E) of the rule is rare.

RESPONSE AND EXPLANATION OF CHANGE: After considering the fact that "natural person" is the term more often used in statutes and regulations than the term "human being," the Attorney General has decided to amend the proposed rule substituting the term "natural person" for "human being" in section (2), subsection (E).

COMMENT: The Missouri Association of Realtors suggested that the definition of "working from his or her primary residence" that appears in section (2), subsection (H) of the rule should address the issue of the use of cell phones.

RESPONSE: The Attorney General has considered this comment and decided to make no change to section (2), subsection (H) of the rule.

15 CSR 60-13.010 Definitions

- (2) The following definitions further clarify terms used in section 407.1095, RSMo 2000 and Chapter 13, Division 60, Title 15 of the *Code of State Regulations*.
- (C) "Business contact" means a specific oral or written communication at a verifiable date and time;
- (D) "Current business relationship" means a relationship characterized by reciprocal communication between the person or entity interested in calling the residential subscriber;
- (E) "Person" exclusively for the purposes of section 407.1095(2), RSMo means a natural person who has reached the legal age set forth in section 431.055, RSMo, as amended, and authorized by the residential subscriber to grant telephone solicitors express invitation or permission to call the residential subscriber's telephone number; and if the residential subscriber has not reached the legal age, set forth in section 431.055, RSMo, as amended, person shall mean his or her parent or legal guardian.

A notice of proposed rulemaking containing the text of the proposed rule was published in the *Missouri Register* on October 16, 2000 (25 MoReg 2538–2541). No changes have been made in the text of the proposed rule, so it is not reprinted here. However, the fiscal note that was published in the *Missouri Register* on October 16, 2000 (25 MoReg 2540–2541) mistakenly referred to the rule's chapter as "10" rather than "13." Accordingly, the fiscal note bearing the correct chapter number is reprinted here. This proposed rule becomes effective thirty days after publication in the *Code of State Regulations*.

SUMMARY OF COMMENT: The Attorney General received three comments on the proposed rule.

COMMENT: AT&T Communications of the Southwest, Inc. commented that the process involved for residential subscribers to give notice of objection to receiving telephone solicitations should include some verification method for those who give notice by phone.

RESPONSE: The Attorney General has considered this comment and has decided to make no change to the rule.

COMMENT: The Missouri Financial Services Association commented that the "no call" database should contain names and addresses of residential subscribers in addition to the "no call" telephone numbers.

RESPONSE: The Attorney General has considered this comment and has decided to make no change to the rule.

COMMENT: The Office of Public Counsel commented that the rule gives Missouri consumers an easy way to enroll in the "no call" database.

RESPONSE: The Attorney General has considered this comment and has decided to make no change to the rule.

COMMENT: Capital Reserve Life Insurance Company identified the error in chapter numbers appearing in the fiscal note on page 2540 of the *Missouri Register*.

RESPONSE AND EXPLANATION OF CHANGE: The Attorney General first submitted proposed "no call" rules (with accompanying fiscal notes) to the Joint Committee on Administrative Rules and to the Secretary of State on September 21, 2000. Those proposed rules were designated to appear in chapter 10 of 15 CSR 60. The Secretary of State's Administrative Rules staff kindly called the Attorney General's Office and reminded the Attorney General's staff that chapter 10 had already been reserved for another subject. Accordingly, on September 28, 2000, the Attorney General withdrew the proposed "no call" rules designated to appear in chapter 10, and filed with the Joint Committee on Administrative Rules and the Secretary of State the current proposed rules and accompanying fiscal notes bearing a designation for the rules to become chapter 13 of 15 CSR 60. Unfortunately, when the proposed rule was published in the Missouri Register, the fiscal notes published on two of the seven rules were the fiscal notes that accompanied the September 21, 2000 filing, not those accompanying the corrected September 28, 2000 proposed rule filings. Other than the chapter designation, none of the text of the fiscal notes differed between the two filings. To alleviate any confusion, the Attorney General submits below the text of the fiscal note that was filed with the proposed rules on September 28, 2000.

IV. ASSUMPTIONS

- 1. The estimated cost of running this unit were considered. This included rental space for the unit in St. Louis. Additionally, it considers startup costs regarding an Internet access page, 800 automated phone system, 800 toll free lines, and public outreach. This includes personnel services, data processing costs, furniture, office expense, and communication cost.
- 2. In regard to personal services the AGO assumed the need for one (1) AAG IV, one (1) AAG III, four (4) investigators, one (1) legal secretary and .5 information system technician.
- 3. The AGO explored and considered the State of Georgia which has similar no-call legislation and the State of Tennessee. The State of Tennessee has approximately 2.0 million residential lines. This equals approximately 25 % of available residential phone lines on the Tennessee database. Tennessee is a "no fee" state, similar to Missouri. Missouri used Tennessee's database numbers in considering its financial obligations.

COMMENT: Three commenters criticized the automatic renewal mechanism that makes it easy for residential subscribers to maintain their phone numbers in the "no call" database. The Office of Public Counsel "strongly supported" the concept of automatic renewal.

RESPONSE: The Attorney General has considered the comments and has decided to make no change to the rule.

A notice of proposed rulemaking containing the text of the proposed rule was published in the *Missouri Register* on October 16, 2000 (25 MoReg 2545). No changes have been made in the text of the proposed rule, so it is not reprinted here. This proposed rule becomes effective thirty days after publication in the *Code of State Regulations*.

SUMMARY OF COMMENTS: The Attorney General received two comments on the proposed rule.

COMMENT: Southwestern Bell Telephone Company and the Office of Public Counsel both filed comments favorable to the rule. RESPONSE: The Attorney General has considered the comments and has decided to make no change to the rule.

A notice of proposed rulemaking containing the text of the proposed rule was published in the *Missouri Register* on October 16, 2000 (25 MoReg 2545). No changes have been made in the text of the proposed rule, so it is not reprinted here. This proposed rule becomes effective thirty days after publication in the *Code of State Regulations*.

SUMMARY OF COMMENTS: The Attorney General received three comments on the proposed rule.

COMMENT: One commenter stated that the method by which a local telephone exchange carrier could notify the Attorney General that a telephone number had been reassigned was cumbersome. Another commenter stated that revocation of the notice of objection to receiving telephone solicitations should be available through a toll-free number. The Office of Public Counsel filed comments noting that the rule was reasonable to both consumers and telephone companies.

RESPONSE: The Attorney General has considered the comments and has decided to make no change to the rule.

Those sections with changes are reprinted here. In addition, the fiscal notes that were published in the *Missouri Register* on October 16, 2000 (25 MoReg 2547–2549) mistakenly referred to the rule's chapter as "10" rather than "13." Accordingly, the fiscal notes bearing the correct chapter number are also reprinted here. This proposed rule becomes effective thirty days after publication in the *Code of State Regulations*.

SUMMARY OF COMMENTS: The Attorney General received twenty-four comments on the proposed rule.

COMMENT: The Attorney General filed the Order of Rulemaking with the Joint Committee on Administrative Rules ("JCAR") on November 22, 2000. The JCAR held a hearing on December 20, 2000, and approved the rule subject to the Attorney General's deleting the following text from 15 CSR 60-13.060(2):

However, if a person or entity who initiates any voice communication over a telephone line from a live operator, through the use of ADAD equipment or by other means for the purpose of encouraging the purchase or rental of, or investment in, property, goods or services and who claims that such communication falls under one of the exclusions to the definition of "telephone solicitation" appearing in section 407.1095(3), RSMo, does not submit a notice of the claimed exclusion to the Attorney General's Office; then that person or entity shall not have established and implemented, with due care, reasonable practices and procedures to effectively prevent telephone solicitations in the event that that person or entity's practices become the subjection of litigation under Chapter 407, RSMo

RESPONSE AND EXPLANATION OF CHANGE: The Attorney General agreed to the suggested change. Also, the Attorney General corrects the spelling of the word "notarized" in the body of the rule.

COMMENT: Several commenters suggested that section (1) of the proposed rule be clarified to allow a person who wants to receive a copy of the no-call database to share the copy with employees or independent contractors.

RESPONSE AND EXPLANATION OF CHANGE: The Attorney General has considered this comment and agrees with it so far as employees are concerned. Accordingly, the Attorney General has amended the proposed rule to clarify that a person or entity who obtains a copy of the no-call database may share it with employees for their lawful use of the database.

COMMENT: A vast number of commenters protested the requirement in section (2) of the proposed rule that persons or entities claiming their activities fall within an exclusion to the definition of "telephone solicitation," as it appears in section 407.1095(3), RSMo 2000, need to file notice with the Attorney General of the claimed exclusion. The same commenters protested the Attorney General's review of the claimed exclusion and the loss of ability to claim that such person established and implemented, with due care, reasonable practices and procedures to effectively prevent telephone solicitations for those who do not submit notice or are informed by the Attorney General's Office that the Attorney General's Office does not recognize their use of the exclusion. The commenters expressed an opinion that the proposed rule exceeded the statutory grant of authority.

RESPONSE AND EXPLANATION OF CHANGE: After considering the comments, the Attorney General has decided to amend the proposed rule doing away with the concept of mandatory filing for claimed exclusions. Instead, persons claiming an exclusion may submit a notarized affidavit of the claimed exclusion to the Attorney General's Office. Submitting such an affidavit will not, in and of itself establish the section 407.1110.4, RSMo, defense for an action brought for violation of section 407.1098, RSMo, or section 407.1107, RSMo. But, those claiming an exclusion who do not submit notice to the Attorney General will not have established and implemented, with due care, reasonable practices and procedures to effectively prevent telephone solicitations in the event that such person or entity's practice become the subject of litigation under Chapter 407, RSMo.

COMMENT: One commenter identified the error in chapter numbers appearing in the fiscal note on pages 2547 and 2549 of the *Missouri Register*.

RESPONSE AND EXPLANATION OF CHANGE: The Attorney General first submitted proposed "no call" rules (with accompanying fiscal notes) to the Joint Committee on Administrative Rules and to the Secretary of State on September 21, 2000. Those proposed rules were designated to appear in chapter 10 of 15 CSR 60. The Secretary of State's Administrative Rules staff kindly called

the Attorney General's Office and reminded the Attorney General's staff that chapter 10 had already been reserved for another subject. Accordingly, on September 28, 2000, the Attorney General withdrew the proposed "no call" rules designated to appear in chapter 10, and filed with the Joint Committee on Administrative Rules and the Secretary of State the current proposed rules and accompanying fiscal notes bearing a designation for the rules to become chapter 13 of 15 CSR 60. 15 CSR 60-13.060 Methods by Which a Person or Entity Desiring to Make Telephone Solicitations Will Obtain Access to the Database of Residential Subscribers' Notices of Objection to Receiving Telephone Solicitations and the Cost Assessed for Access to the Database

- (1) A person or entity desiring to make telephone solicitations to residential subscribers residing or living in Missouri may obtain a copy of the no-call database for his, her or its lawful use, or for the lawful use by his, her or its employees, by doing the following:
- (2) A person or entity who initiates any voice communication over a telephone line from a live operator, through the use of ADAD equipment or by other means for the purpose of encouraging the purchase or rental of, or investment in, property, goods or services and who claims that such communication falls under one of the exclusions to the definition of "telephone solicitation" appearing in section 407.1095(3), RSMo, as amended, may provide notice in the form of a notarized affidavit to the Attorney General's Office of that person or entity's intention to utilize the claimed exclusion along with an explanation of the basis for that person's claimed exclusion. The Attorney General's Office may investigate the claimed exclusion using the powers available under section 407.1110, RSMo, as amended. Submitting an affidavit to the Attorney General of intention to utilize a claimed exclusion shall not, in and of itself, establish the section 407.1110.4, RSMo, defense to an action brought for violation of section 407.1098, RSMo, or section 407.1107, RSMo.

IV. ASSUMPTIONS

- 1. Determining the number and types of entities affected by these rules cannot be estimated with greater specificity than appears in this fiscal note because business entities' use of telephone solicitations vary greatly. In an effort to provide information to the potential affected entities, we have looked at Tennessee as we have done in regard to the number of residential consumers that have entered the database. Tennessee began taking names January 1, 2000, and required its telemarketers to receive the information beginning August 1, 2000. It currently has 290 entities that are required to obtain the database on a monthly basis.
- 2. The Attorney General's Office will have the capability to produce the database on CD. This cost is part of the start-up costs set out in 15 CSR 60-13.020. The cost of producing the CD is approximately \$25 a piece. Using \$25 and assuming the Tennessee number of 40, this results in a quarterly cost of \$1,000 or \$4,000 per year. The postage cost for mailing the database to be nominal at approximately \$500 per year. The remaining requests, again using the Tennessee numbers, will be performed by e-mail and will include only a nominal charge, if any.

It is assumed that the business entities may obtain the database in the last quarter of FY 01. The business entities will be assessed the yearly fee in FY 02.
- 2. Determining the number and types of entities affected by these rules cannot be estimated with greater precision than appear herein because the rule could apply to any business entity that uses telephone solicitations. Additionally, the needs of specific businesses will change and so will the use of telemarketing. In an effort to provide information to all the potential entities impacted, we have looked at Tennessee as we have done in regard to the number of residential consumers who have entered the database. Tennessee, like Missouri, is a "no-fee" state. Tennessee began taking entries on January 1, 2000, and required its telemarketers to receive the information beginning August 1, 2000. It currently has 290 entities that obtain the database on a monthly basis. Two hundred fifty entities receive this by e-mail and 40 by disk.
- 3. The second portion of potential costs consists of the implementation of the database into its daily operations. Each business entity will exercise its own control on how to use the database. For that reason, the cost of implementation, if any, will vary and cannot be estimated with greater specificity than appears in this fiscal note. The remaining cost issue is the determination of whether a particular entity will incur costs to determine its exemption status. Again, what entities will use "telephone solicitations" will vary greatly. For this reason, though each entity's cost may be nominal, aggregate costs are not quantifiable with greater specificity than appears within this fiscal note. The database acquisition and implementation costs will be annual charges recurring in perpetuity. The exemption process should be a one time charge, assuming no change in a business entity's business practice. The annual costs will start in FY 01 and continue for the indefinite life of the rule.

ORDER OF RULEMAKING

By the authority vested in the Attorney General under section 407.1101, RSMo 2000, the Attorney General adopts a rule as follows:

15 CSR 60-13.070 Other Matters Relating to the Database of Residential Subscribers' Notices of Objection to Receiving Telephone Solicitations **is adopted**.

A notice of proposed rulemaking containing the text of the proposed rule was published in the *Missouri Register* on October 16, 2000 (25 MoReg 2552). No changes have been made in the text of the proposed rule, so it is not reprinted here. This proposed rule becomes effective thirty days after publication in the *Code of State Regulations*.

SUMMARY OF COMMENTS: The Attorney General received two comments on the proposed rule.

COMMENT: Southwestern Bell Telephone Company and the Office of Public Counsel both filed comments supportive of the rule.

RESPONSE: The Attorney General has considered the comments and has decided to make no change to the rule.

Title 20—DEPARTMENT OF INSURANCE Division 500—Property and Casualty Chapter 6—Workers' Compensation and Employer's Liability

ORDER OF RULEMAKING

By the authority vested in the Department of Insurance under section 374.045, RSMo 2000, the department withdraws a proposed amendment to a rule as follows:

20 CSR 500-6.700 Workers' Compensation Managed Care Organizations **is withdrawn**.

A notice of proposed rulemaking containing the text of the proposed amendment was published in the *Missouri Register* on October 2, 2000 (25 MoReg 2446–2458). This proposed amendment is withdrawn.

SUMMARY OF COMMENTS: This proposed amendment to 20 CSR 500-6.700 was a comprehensive overhaul of an existing rule on workers' compensation managed care organizations (MCOs). The proposed amendment was designed to comply with language in section 287.135, RSMo (enacted in 1993), which directed the Department of Insurance to promulgate rules regarding: 1) the certification criteria for workers' compensation MCOs; 2) the criteria under which the fees charged by an MCO would be reimbursed by an employer's workers' compensation insurer; and, 3) criteria for the coordination and integration of MCO and insurer internal operating systems. The department received numerous oral and written comments from organizations representing insurance companies, managed care organizations, employers and employees expressing concern regarding this proposed amendment. These comments have demonstrated that substantial disagreement exists regarding the appropriate language to be used in this proposed amendment. RESPONSE: As a result, the department has decided to withdraw this proposed amendment for further consideration of the issues.

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
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
