



well and truly administer according to law; and further do make or cause to be made a true and
just account of his laid administration, at or before the *Twenty fourth* day of ^{August}
1814 — and all the rest and residue of the said goods, chattels and credits, which shall be
found remaining upon the said administrators account, the same being first examined by the Judge
of Probate of said ^{County} district, and allowed by the orphans Court of said ^{County} district, shall deliver and pay
unto such person or persons respectively as the said orphans court by their decree or sentence pur-
suant to the true intent and meaning of the law, shall limit and appoint, and if it shall hereafter
appear, that any last will or testament, was made by the said deceased, and the executor or execu-
tors therein named, do exhibit the same into the office of the Judge of Probate, making request
to have it allowed and approved accordingly, if the said *Joshua Tansey*

within bounden being thereto required, do render and deliver the said letter of
administration, approbation of such testament being first had and made in the office of the judge of
probate; then this obligation to be void and of none effect, or else to remain in full force and
virtue.
