Judgement and calling the mortalities of the body and
knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die do
make and ordain this my last will and testament
in manner and form; first I commend my soul to God
who give it and my body to be buried in a decent
Christian manner at the discretion of my Executors
and for the worldly goods wherewith it has pleased God to
bless me I leave and bequeath in the following manner
first I will that all my Lawfull Debts be paid and my
funeral Expenses be discharged -

of my Estate real and personal -
I will to my son John Wickham 200 acres of Land on
Big river which is now at work to begin at the upper end

and to John Wickham one hundred acres near Big river
joining his Brother William Land.

hole breadth of the line
I will to my Daughter Polly Wife Ten Dollars to be
raised out of my Estate
I will that the Balance of my Estate both real and

her six ^{children} that she had by her first husband

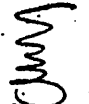
