Article I, section 23 of the Missouri Constitution is revised by adding the following:
Section 23(a). In compliance with the Second Amendment of the Constitution of the United States and limited by decisions of the United States Supreme Court or federal law, and county, the City of St. Louis, and the city of Kansas City may, by ordinance duly enacted, regulate the possession or carrying of firearms within the limits of the city or county notwithstanding any other provision of law, subject to the following:
1. An ordinance authorizing the issuance of a permit or certificate may provide for the city or county to charge a fee sufficient to cover the cost of issuing permits certificates but which does not exceed the cost therefor and provided that such permits or certificates shall be valid for no longer than five years. The city or county may obtain background-check information from the federal National Instant Background Check System or other governmental agency providing information service.
2. Any ordinance adopted in accordance with this section may apply to non-residents as well as residents of the city or county, but shall recognize as valid any perm or certificate issued for possessing or carrying firearms issued by the permit or certificate holder's county of residence. Any such ordinance also shall exempt any active duty of retired law enforcement officer who is currently certified as compliant with state peace officer's standards and training, any full time judge, or any person who must be armed a condition of employment during active employment as a licensed security guard or as a government employee, including military.
3. Any ordinance adopted hereunder may provide penalties for violation, but such penalties shall not exceed a fine of \$1,000 or imprisonment in the county jail for term exceeding one year, or both. An ordinance also may authorize seizure of any firearm, by a law enforcement officer upon probable cause, where the possessor is ineligible law to possess the firearm.

NOTICE: the proposed amendment revises Article I, section 23 of the Constitution by adopting a new section to be known as Section 23(a).
