STATE OF MISSOURI



The Great Seal of Missouri is circular. It features a central shield with a plow, a sheaf of wheat, and a sheaf of corn. Above the shield is a five-pointed star. A laurel wreath surrounds the shield. The outer border contains the text "THE GREAT SEAL OF THE STATE OF MISSOURI" at the top and "MDCCCLXXX" at the bottom. Below the wreath, the motto "MISERICORDIA DOMINI EST ET SEMPER FIDE ET PAX" is inscribed.

To All who shall See these Presents---Greeting :

Whereas, It appears by the duplicate receipts of the Clerk of the County Court of Carroll County, in the State of Missouri, that Henry Carey, of Carroll County, Missouri, did on the ninth day of July in the year of our Lord eighteen hundred and sixty eight purchase the

North West Quarter of the North West Quarter of Section One in Township forty two of Range twenty four containing thirty eight and 49 acres, at the price of twelve Dollars and forty cents per acre, being part of the lands selected under an act of Congress entitled "An act to enable the State of Arkansas and other States, to reclaim the Swamp Lands within their limits," approved September 28, 1850, for the sum of one hundred & eighty two dollars and thirteen cents.

And Whereas, It further appears by said receipts, full payment therefor has been made by said Henry Carey
 Now Know Ye, That I, Thomas Le Fletcher Governor of the State of Missouri, in consideration of the premises, and by virtue of authority in me vested by law, have given and granted, and by these presents do give and grant unto the said Henry Carey, and his heirs, the above described tract of land: **TO HAVE AND TO HOLD** the same, with the appurtenances, unto the said Henry Carey, his heirs and assigns forever.

In Witness Whereof, I, Thomas Le Fletcher Governor of the State of Missouri, have caused these letters to be made **PATENT**, and have hereunto set my hand and caused to be affixed the **GREAT SEAL** of the State of Missouri. Done at the City of Jefferson, this twenty first day of December in the year of our Lord One Thousand Eight Hundred and sixty eight, of the Independence of the United States the one hundred thirty third, and of the State of Missouri the first.
