L W Bogs Goviner of the State of Missorie I adress a few lines to inform you that I have Sent a petition to the Supreem Judges Which will show to you the Distresed Situation of your petitioner and his helplis family as well I can set it forth in this letter I there fore request that you Read the Said Pet ition wishes that after you have Read the Said petition and Hear the Evidence of the Barr of this and other Evidences whi ch I will produse also youre Excelency was personly acquainted with me in Jackson County and with the sufering of my self and family that I gave up my arms and left the county [I have __upon_] and my family as you [] in the petition have been Driven from the State a wife and Six helplis ["family" crossed out] children in a tent on the Bank of the Mississippi River Without food and Rayment and there Life Depends on my Being a [miditly Bilund therefore your petitioner asks

in the name of Humanity Honor Justice

and the cries of infant children that you Read this and forth with grant

your petitioner a releas from this
Confinement with out anny furthr
trial and send me a reply by the
same By So Doing you may save the
Lives of inosent women and infant chil
-ren Shoud you Do So youre servant
will Be Exeedenly Greatful to youre
Excilency and for this youre Petitioner
earnestly Pray
