I have just read with pleasure

of the arrest of that notorious Rockwell, and I will say to you that it has created no small excitement amongs the Mormons. I am now more than ever satisfied of the guilt of Joe & I know he fears that Rockwell will turn traitor. If the right method is pursued I am satisfied that he will do so for we all know that a midnight assassin will stop at nothing in a general way. Those villians at Nauvoo have ascertained by some means that I was watching them closely and they deceived me egregiously in regard to the location of Rockwell What I wrote you a short time ago respecting his being in the Pinery in Wisconsin was told me in a very careless manner by one of the ladies & I supposed it to be true. but I am now convinced that it was done purposely to deceive me. I fear some difficulties with them but my house [a] pretty fair ar= senal and if they interfere with me I shall give them the best show possible. I intend leaving the infernal Mormon region in one month more Respectfully
