Jonesborough. 24th Sept 1838 .

The commander in chief having this morning received information by expresz that The Civil disturbance in the Counties of Davis and Caldwell have been quieted- and order restored to the Country,. He therefore orders that the Troops under your command destined for that service be immediately discharged.

The commander in Chief avails himself of the present occasion to tender to you and through you to the Troops under your command his thanks for the prompt manner in which they have responded to his call of their country.
