The House met pursuant to adjournment.

Mr. Holeman,

Presented the petition of Thomas Bohannon, of Ray county, asking the Legislature to pass an act for his relief, by remunerating him in losses sustained by the troops ordered out to suppress the *Mormon* difficulties, which was committed by the troops in encamping on and cutting the timber from the lands of said Bohannon;

The petition was, on motion of Mr. Holeman, referred to the committee on Military Affairs.

Mr. Geyer from the committee on the judiciary, made the following report:—

That they have had under consideration a resolution of the House directing them to enquire into the expediency of making clerks of county courts ex officio recorders of their respective counties, and also the expediency of raising said clerk's fees in probate business, and are of opinion that it is inexpedient to transfer the office of Recorder from the clerks of the Circuit courts, to the clerks of the county courts; or to increase the fees allowed by law, to clerks of county courts on probate business.

And therefore respectfully ask to be discharged from the further consideration of the subject, which was agreed to.
