An act supplementary to an act to establish courts of record and prescribe their powers and duties,

Was read a third time,

Mr. Sterigere moved to amend by way of ryder,

Strike out first and second sections,

Which was read a first time, and

Objections being made,

Was rejected;

The question,

On the passage of the bill,

Was decided affirmatively as follows:

A bill for relief of certain persons therein named,

As amended by the House was read and

On motion of Mr. Monroe.

Was laid on the table,

An act supplementary to an act regulating conveyances approved February 3d, 1835,

Was read a third time,

Mr. Ashby moved that the bill be indefinitely postponed,

Which was decided affirmatively,

An act to amend the laws in relation to appeals,

Was read a third time and

On motion of Mr. Darby,

Indefinitely postponed,

An act supplementary to an act to regulate fees,

Was read a first time, and

On motion of Mr. Monroe,

Laid on the table,

Mr. Penn from the select committee to whom had been referred a bill to provide for paying the expenses of the Mormon War &c.

Reported back the same without amendment,

Mr. Penn offered to amend the bill by way of ryder,

Strike out of the fifth section and insert the following:

Sec. 3. That the paymaster General is hereby required and directed to pay out of the appropriation provided for in this act, the officers for services actually rendered and for the number of horses and servants actually employed and none others and it is hereby made the duty of said paymaster to suspend the pay of any officer who on his own responsibility ordered out more officers and men than the service into which they were ordered seemed to require.

Such suspended pay shall be reported to the next General Assembly together with the reasons therefor certified by the paymaster General.

Which was read a first time, and

Objections being made,

Was decided negatively as follows:
