Sir

On the 30<sup>th</sup> ultimo an order was directed to you to cause three hundred mounted men to be raised and held in readiness subject to further orders from the Commander in Chief. Information had just been received by the Executive that an insurrection now actually exists in the Counties of Caldwell & Davess.

You will therefore with the men already raised within your division, immediately march to the scene of difficulty, and cooperate with Genl Atchison and other officers, in restoring quiet to the Country, and in suppressing the insurrection, each man will furnish himself with at least an days provision, and the necessary arms and ammunition. Your action upon this subject is required to be immediate and prompt. You will of course give preference to Volunteer Companies already organized and subject to be called out on Maps.

On the 30<sup>th</sup> ultimo an order was directed to

days provision, and the necessary arms and ammu-  
nition. Your action on this subject is required to  
be prompt and immediate. You will of course give  
the preference to Volunteers. Companies already  
organized and that are subject by law to be  
ordered out - en Masse.

Sir,

On the 31<sup>st</sup> ultimo an order was directed  
to you to cause five hundred Militia men to be raised  
within your Division and held in readiness for further  
orders from the Command in Chief. Information has  
just reached the Governor, which in his opinion  
renders it absolutely necessary, that a sufficient force  
be immediately marched to the scene of difficulty with  
the view of restoring peace, and preventing the effusion  
of Blood.

You will therefore cause the number of men  
required of your Division to rendezvous at Fayette, and  
march forthwith to the Counties of Davie or Calwell  
(as the case may be) and cooperate with Major Emil  
Stephenson of the 3<sup>rd</sup> Division (who is now there) in  
suppressing the insurrection and restoring order  
to the Community. Each man will provide himself  
with at least ten days provision and the necessary  
arms and ammunition. Your prompt and early  
attention to this ~~matter~~ order is urgently  
required. Preference of course will always <sup>be given</sup>  
to volunteer Companies already organized
