Sir. The accompanying
two letters or reports from Maj: Gen: Atchison
Brig: Gen: Doniphan, on the subject of the Mor:
:now difficulties, the former directed to your
excellency, & the latter from Gen: Doniphan
to Gen: Atchison, have just been received by express,
deeming them of sufficient importance to
justify the sending of them to you by express.
I have engaged Jesse B. Baber esq. for that pur:
:pose, who will leave some time to night, or
very early in the morning.

From the tenor of these
papers it would appear that there is no
necessity for the troops, that have been rai:
:sed from this Division to march. The Com:
:manding officer, however, does not consider
that he would be justifiable in disbanding
them, or suspending, for a few days, operations
without express orders to that effect from
the Commander-in-Chief. He has accordingly
13 taken up, a few moments ago, the line of
march, for the seat of difficulties.
