

morning, by the assistance of friends we did start leaving most of our property there, since then I have returned and found the houses burnt & the property gone consisting of household plunder and 29 bee gums they enquired for guns and got down one and took it away from the house belonging to one Josiah Littlefield they further said that they had been there as long as they were a going to, that they had got strong enough now to defend themselves that they intended to do it by the sword that they knew at the defiance of any set of men who could come against them & that they now intended to make it a war of extermination, the following of the dependants were in the above Company vizt. James H. Raultens Jesse B. Hunter Darwin Chase & I think from his appearance Maurice Phelps was there but may be mistaken, Hunter appeared to be Captain or Commander of the Company as he did the most of the talking, but most all of them had something to say and further this deponent with his

John Raglin a witness produced sworn and examined on behalf the State deposed and said I was in Fallstein when the Mormons made an attack on it which took place on ^{the} Thursday in October all the persons that were there left the town and the Mormons as I believe them to be to the number of about 150 or 200 all armed took possession of the town and the store and other houses were burnt as I learned that evening and further this deponent with his

Allen Rathburn a witness produced sworn and examined on behalf of the State deposed and said, On the day before the battle with Rogoid I was in far West and early in the morning Daniel Carn One of the dependants here asked me to help him to grease his Waggon I did so and asked him where he was going he said he was going out to Mr Raglins in Davis County that there were about 40 bee stores there they were going for. directly after words I was down at Morrisons Store in far west there was a Company of 10 or 12 men with 2 or 3 waggons I heard Mr Huntingdon ask for brimstone some of the Company said they ^{had} 2 pounds Huntingdon answered that would do, Mr Hunter one of the dependants here, gave the word of command and they marched off Mr Daniel Carn with his waggon with them late that evening I saw Daniel Carn with his waggon at his grocery door in far west I saw Carn and Huntingdon unloading the waggon was loaded with one bee gum and household plunder consisting of beds or bed cloaths Kinder tied up also there were onions in the waggon Mr Carn that evening remarked that there would be in that night

a considerable number of Sheep and Cattle, he further said that it looked to him sometimes that it was not right to take plunder but that it was according to Jos Smith's directions and that was the reason why he did it. the next morning I saw a considerable number of Sheep on the Square in far West near about 100. I then left far west and returned home in the east part of Caldwell County having been summoned to far west by my militia captain but performed no military duty while there and further this Depoent saith not Allen Parkburn

Jeremiah Myers a witness produced sworn and examined deposeseth and saith I was in the last expedition to Darius being summoned from my home in the east part of Caldwell County by my militia officer to go to far West where I was told we had to march to Darius and did so. I think it was the third day after our arrival at Dishmon that Capt Ferris's Company of about 100 men started out and not until we got near to Sallatin did I learn where they were going I was then told there was a mob at Sallatin and that we were going to disperse them when within about 1/2 mile of Sallatin we formed and rushed into town in a hurrah I only saw 2 men who were running others said there were about 15 we gathered up around the store and some went in halloing bring them out here supposing there were men in the house about this time myself and another man returned to camp at Dishmon that evening I saw store goods at the Bishop's Store and was informed by Mahlon Johnson One of the Company to Sallatin that the goods taken from the store in Sallatin were the goods I saw deposited in the Bishop's Store, they were called and carried away (goods) or property and that they were to be dealt out by the bishop to those that stood in need, I saw parties coming in and going out whole in camp but saw no property come into our camp but I saw a pen of Cattle which was called Buffalo the following of the Depoents were in the last expedition to Darius. Jos Smith Jr. Sylvan Wright who resides in Dishmon Washington Voorhis I never saw Sylvan Wright in command during this Expedition my camp was half a mile from Wright's and I staid pretty constantly about my own camp. I do not recollect that I was in any other Expedition than the one to Sallatin Ebenezer Page
