Wolfner Talking Book and Braille Library provides informational and recreational materials in Braille, audio formats, and large print free of charge to Missourians who cannot use standard print materials due to blindness, visual or physical impairment, or a reading disability. Wolfner Library also provides disability-related information to the public.

Wolfner Library is part of the National Library Service for the Blind and Print Disabled (NLS). All Wolfner Library materials are mailed free of charge through the U.S. Postal Service as "Free Matter for the Blind and Physically Handicapped" under Public Law 91-375.

- To request books or magazines
- For information about titles, subjects, authors, or you want to read a book series in chronological order
- To increase or decrease the number of books you receive
- For technical assistance downloading from WolfPAC or BARD
- You stop receiving materials
- Your player is not working correctly or gets lost or stolen

- You wish to have your service put on hold
- To return materials or equipment you are not using
- You wish to discontinue service.

LOAN PERIODS & POLICY

The goal of Wolfner Library is to provide you with your preferred reading material regularly. Returning items as soon as you finish them guarantees a steady book flow.

• The standard loan period for a book, not including transit time, is six (6) weeks.

SHIPMENT INTERVAL CHOICES

Request List Only

You supply us with a list of books and other materials that you would like to receive. Each time you return an item to Wolfner Library, another will be shipped from your list. You may add items to your request list by calling a reader advisor (1-800-392-2614) or going to your online library account through the online catalog, the WolfPAC, at <u>https://wolfpac.klas.com</u>.

System Selection

You tell us your favorite genres, favorite authors, and your preferences regarding materials that contain sexual content,

violence, and strong language. By telling us what you like and dislike, we can better program the system to send you appropriate materials.

HOW PATRONS RECEIVE/RETURN MATERIALS

Materials from Wolfner Library will arrive with a mailing label in a label holder outside the container. When you finish the item, take the mail card off the container so our return address sticker underneath the card will show, and place it in your mailbox, no postage necessary.

DAMAGED MATERIALS

If an item is damaged or defective when you receive it, or it becomes damaged while you are using it, notify Wolfner Library, and you will be sent another copy.

DIGITAL PLAYERS

Wolfner Library is proud to provide digital audio playback players to its patrons at no cost for as long as they are patrons.

Player Tip: Bookshelf Mode

To read cartridges with multiple books,

1. Insert cartridge in player

- 2. Press and hold "Play/Stop" to enter *bookshelf mode*
- 3. Press RW or FF to navigate through the book titles. Once you have found the desired book press Play/Stop again to play the book.

ZOOMAX ELECTRONIC BRAILLE READER

Wolfner Library is proud to provide the Zoomax electronic braille reader to patrons at no cost for as long as they are patrons. They may download chosen books or receive them on digital Braille cartridges.

DOWNLOAD TALKING BOOKS FROM HOME

Why wait for the postal service to deliver your books? Download audio and braille books from BARD 24 hours a day, seven days a week.

Your Wolfner Library digital audio playback player and/or Zoomax eReader is compatible with downloaded BARD titles. Braille and Audio Reading Download (BARD), provided by The National Library Service for the Blind and Print Disabled, Library of Congress has over 100,000 digital books and 100 digital magazines.

Using the Wolfner Library Online Public Access Catalog (WolfPAC)

All Wolfner Library materials have unique book numbers. The letter prefix identifies the item's format. Include the title, author, and catalog number when requesting books to ensure receipt of the correct item. The following list identifies the format prefixes:

- BR: Braille
- DB: Digital Cartridge
- DBC: Locally Recorded Book
- LP: Large Print

NFB-NEWSLINE®

Wolfner Library offers NFB-NEWSLINE®, a touchtone telephone or online service for patrons who cannot read a printed newspaper. NFB-NEWSLINE® uses text-to-speech technology to read aloud the text from newspapers across the country. This service is available toll-free statewide.
